As a surveyor, what does a typical day look like for you?

Due to a knee operation I'm not out surveying at the moment, but before this my mornings would usually involve catching up with emails before visiting sites to undertake any surveys booked in that morning. After lunch, I'd then either go home or back to the office to complete the survey write up, check over any previous reports I've written and get them issued to clients.

On top of this, as Director, I might make a few courtesy calls, chat with my Office Administrator to see if they need any support and, where I can, work on business strategy.

What made you consider a career in surveying?

A career in surveying is what I've aimed for from the start. My late father was a self-employed land surveyor and I would sit with him in the office, watching him work. I didn't know it at the time, but perhaps this played a subconscious role in my interest in surveying.

At school, I wasn't sure what I wanted to be. I did A-Levels for one year but didn't connect with it. In my final year in school, I worked as a labourer for a builder which was hands on and really interested me, but I wanted something more professional. I was also fascinated by architecture, so that piqued my interest in buildings.

What qualification route did you take and why?

After doing a BTEC in Construction and the Built Environment in college, I had lots of options ahead of me and chose to go down the Building Surveying pathway because the pathology and design side of things interested me.

I studied for a degree in Building Surveying at Leeds Metropolitan University (now Leeds Beckett) and started working part time for global firm, Faithful and Gould.

What has been the highlight of your career so far?

Definitely achieving APC and getting Chartered. It was a great personal achievement, but I also had a lot of support from my company and peers.

Becoming Chartered gave me more confidence on both a professional and personal level. Everyone experiences imposter syndrome at some point in their life, but becoming Chartered helped to validate that I was capable enough as a well-rounded surveyor. Now, when speaking with other professionals, I have a real sense of confidence in what I'm saying.

What do you love most about being a surveyor?

Early on in my career, it was how much I was learning constantly and pushing the boundaries of what I knew. There was always a challenge and I was never bored. Right now, with a young family and another little one on the way, it's the flexibility – I can be at home when I need to be and around for my family.

What advice would you give to anyone thinking of joining the profession?

Go where the opportunities are - let them lead you. Have a goal in mind but don't just focus on one thing. I had my mind set on becoming Chartered as soon as I could, but I had lots of opportunities in between to gain more qualifications and build my expertise.

When I started out, I was doing commercial work, and progression was a lot quicker than expected. I was a little unprepared for the added responsibility so early in my career. My advice to new joiners is to learn continuously and be prepared to prove yourself from the start.

How does you feel being named a finalist in the RICS Matrics Surveyor Awards 2023?

Shocked and chuffed with a little bit of disbelief. It was a complete surprise! I put a lot of effort into the case studies and application, but there were so many great surveyors out there with big presences in the field and on social media, so I feel proud to have made it through to the shortlist.

That said, I've had a good, varied career so far and it's great to be recognised for the hard work I've put into building my business and supporting the industry.
